November 2021 CVPOC President's Message

While it may seem like bad timing to be talking about the ARC, the Architectural Review Committee, in November when most of the building stuff for the year is over, I've got a couple of reasons to do so. I think the best reason to start off with is that there is a new ARC being formed. With approval from the Board, Tashi Fonteyn will be the new Chair. The ARC members are Kathee Melahn, Ben Davidson and Ted Hocker. I will step down from the committee and provide consultation when requested. Please welcome and be patient with these neighbors who volunteer their time to provide the Village this service.

Having served a couple of years as a member of the ARC, I saw examples of the evolution of this Village and the policies that governed it. Some things that were permissible in the past are no longer so. Some things that were not allowed in the past are now accepted practices. Coast Village is continually changing, but our governing documents are there to help us retain the charm we purchased here for and guide us as we evolve. We have an updated ARC Policies and Procedures document approved by the board earlier this year. The intent is that this document is continually updated as issues encountered lead to refinements and additions to the document. Please pick up your most recent version from the office to review BEFORE you begin your next building project and read it through to make sure your design meets the necessary requirements.

While the ARC works to be efficient, they have to schedule and coordinate more than just your project to fit into their available volunteer hours. Allow some time to obtain your permit and have it posted BEFORE you begin working on your project. The goal of the ARC is to help you get your project underway while making sure that you are doing it within the current policies, which are in the ARC Policies and Procedures. (Did I mention that you can get your current version at the office and off the website?) There are hefty fines for beginning your project before you have obtained your permit, which is something that nobody likes to give or get. Please plan ahead.

This past month I have observed some behavior that reinforced my feelings that this is the right place to live for me. People showing grace for each other, recognizing everyone's angst and vulnerability that has accrued during this world wide shift in our economy, sense of safety, being able to see family and friends easily and without a sense of threat.

I have also observed behavior that made me doubt our community as being one of caring, integrity, trust that the right action would occur.

Before we act and judge someone wrong we need to measure the information twice (at least), confirm with that person that the measurement is accurate and then take the appropriate action. We have a code of conduct for our board and our committees and expect our community to act with equal equanimity meaning mental calmness, composure, evenness of temper, especially in a difficult situation.

For me this is the basis of having a smooth working relationship within our community. Not always agreeing but trusting that everyone is trying to come from a place of sincerity and honesty from their perspective. Most of us have acted on our fears and made judgements that were harmful and ones we are not proud of. We are out of balance and harm ourselves as well as others. We must look at our intentions and act in grace and truth. Let's not add to the angry dissension so prevalent in our world. Thank you for listening.

Operations

Good news on our water bill, down to \$9,646.77. That's a reduction of \$1,624.34 from last month. Good job everyone!

Post Office: The repair of the post office is nearly done. We received the full amount from the insurance company after some negotiations and the contractor has been paid in full.

We have discovered a problem with the pump station on Easy Street. This pump station has a concrete holding tank and is an original. It is the only pump station that has not be changed over. The concrete holding tank has developed two holes, they are not all the way through but soon will be. This has to be replaced. I have requested a quote for this project. It is not something we will be able to put off. This will be a large project.

Laundry: Staff have been painting the interior of the laundry room. We apologize for the short delay times as we painted if it delayed anyone doing their laundry. A reminder to please wipe out your machines after use if you have washed or dried items with animal hair or sand.

Water Project: Ongoing – We will be doing something a little different with the remaining sites utilizing a machine to remove sand as hand digging is difficult among all the wires on these remaining sites as well as the sites block driveways and/or road thoroughfare and removing the sand in a different way is safer and quicker.

Raking animal waste into the street. Please do not rake animal waste into the street or place on your yard debris pile without first placing in a bag. We will fine you for that. Staff use tools to pick up yard debris that are not necessarily designed for animal waste and it goes everywhere. Please be considerate of staff.

Planting: We have replanted on the west side where we had greenbelt die, and we have planted a fir on the green near the flag pole to start to grow because we may lose a couple of shore pines from that site if they continue to lean.

We have had several complaints regarding loud noise before 8 a.m. as there has been some construction going on. Please call the POM if/when this happens. The recycle truck does have us on an early schedule so there is nothing we can do regarding that. No loading and unloading or revving of motors on sports utility vehicles should be taking place in the parking lot prior to 8:00 a.m.

I would like to remind everyone that you must have an ARC permit to construct a shed on your property of any kind. Sheds are not considered dwelling units and should not be used as such. I would also like to remind everyone not to construct any type of fence or barrier to keep in your pet without approval from the ARC and Board. You may come to the office for any paperwork you need to apply for approval.

We love our pets but now it's getting colder and wetter and darker, please make sure they are inside at night and up to date on their vaccines.

If you have a pet, we recommend you put something in your file in the office that states your wishes regarding your pet should an emergency occur. Sometimes a situation might happen and your neighbors might not know what to do until a family person could arrive to make further decisions.

We are starting to see trash type of items left on the free table. Any electronics need to be in good working order. Clothing needs to be clean and good repair.

Do not leave old vacuums that don't work property, TVs that are cracked, old mixers that do not work well.

Please put those types of items in your garbage. The free table is for items that are useful that others may be able to utilize.

We are once again having garbage strewn about because of the bears and owners putting their trash out on Sunday night instead of Monday mornings. If we can determine who is doing this you will receive a fine.

If you lose money in the washers and dryers please contact the office or leave a note so we can contact you to refund your money.

This year due to COVID we will not be having the Thanksgiving potluck. The Elks will have free dinners on Thanksgiving Day, drive through/pick up only beginning at 11:30 a.m.

Many of our members have left for the winter. Be a good neighbor and give us a heads up if you see suspicious people or traffic on a lot you know is empty. Maintenance does keep an eye out but it's not possible to watch everything.

Now is a great time to place new bushes/trees in the ground. With our mild fall, they should start very well and won't take as much water.

A reminder to put your Lot number on your check. Especially if you have two lots it is much easier to apply your payment correctly.

Be very careful if you are dropping off or picking up children at the gate. Keep your children with you, if they run around the block wall incoming traffic might not see them. We don't want anyone injured.

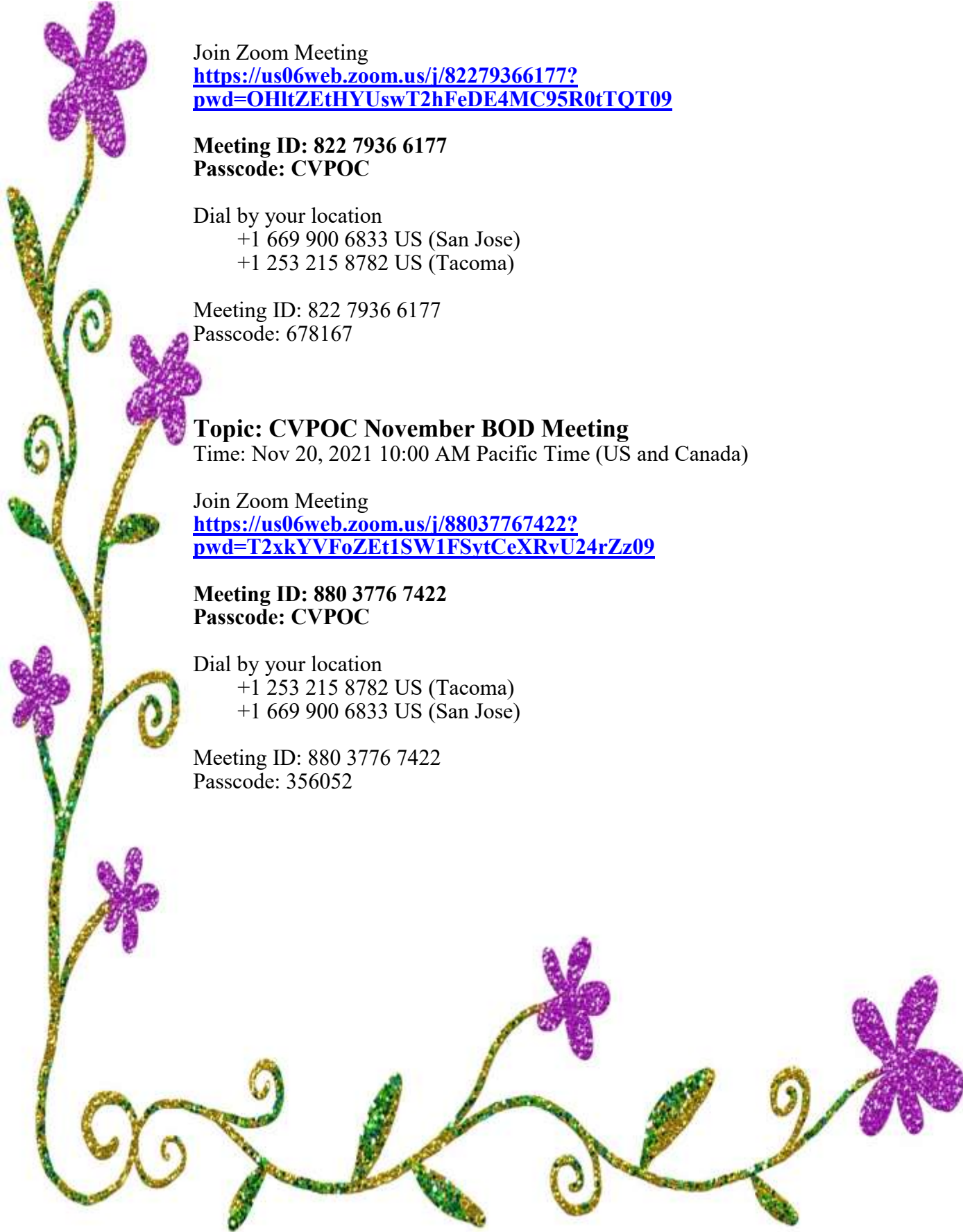

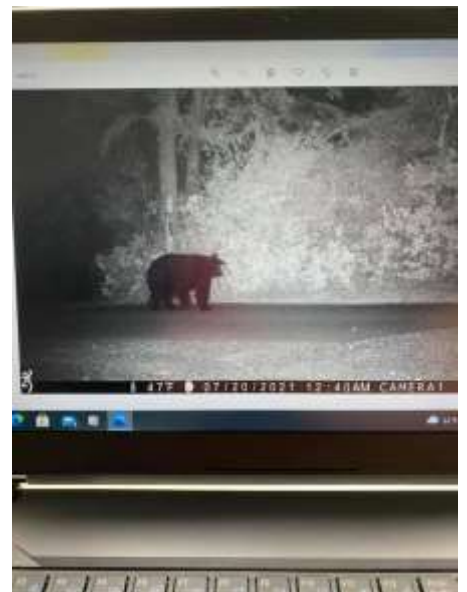

IN THE KITCHEN

Meat Loaf

Preheat the oven to 400°. In a medium skillet, heat the oil. Add the onion, carrots, celery and garlic and cook over medium heat for 10 minutes until softened.

Scrape the mixture into a very large bowl and let cool. Add the *panko*, eggs, mustard, ketchup, Worcestershire sauce, Tabasco, 1 1/2 tablespoons of salt and 1 teaspoon of pepper and stir to form a paste. Using your hands, work in the ground meats and cheese until combined.

Ingredients

Ingredient Checklist

- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 1 large onion (finely chopped)
- 2 large carrots (finely chopped)
- 1 celery rib (finely chopped)
- 2 garlic cloves (minced)
- 1 ½ cups panko bread crumbs
- 4 large eggs
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 2 tablespoons ketchup
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon Tabasco
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 3 pounds ground beef chuck
- 1 pound ground pork
- ½ pound Monterey Jack cheese (cut into 1/2-inch cubes)

Step 2

Line a large roasting pan with parchment paper. Firmly pat the meat mixture into 2 loaves, about 10 inches long. Arrange the loaves 3 inches apart on the parchment and roast in the lower third of the oven for about 1 hour, until lightly browned and an instant-read thermometer inserted in the center of the loaves registers 150°. Let the meat loaves rest for 15 minutes, then cut into thick slices and serve with the Creamy Onion Gravy.

Make Ahead

The baked meat loaves can be covered and refrigerated for up to 4 days. Cut the meat loaves into thick slices and brown in a skillet to serve.
