Presidents Message:

The big water project (WP1) is moving along nicely, we are approaching 100 lots completed. However enough additional related but unexpected repairs have been 'uncovered' (for example, replacing all the 'saddles' that connect the branch pipe for each lot to the main) that a second project (WP2) is now being defined and will be discussed at the March Board of Directors meeting.

Approval of WP2 will require a ballot of all the lots in Coast Village; it is part of repairing our water system that is basically being required of us by the City. The end result of completing both water projects should be a significant reduction in the amount of water being lost to leaking saddles and pipe connections plus the ability to identify and help quickly resolve major leaks within Coast Village.

Everyone should have received ballots for 2 replacements on the Board of Directors, we have 4 candidates so please take a look at their declarations and make sure to return your ballot by March 15.

Quick reminder about Stop Signs- sort of obvious to point out that we have narrow roads with no sidewalks here in Coast Village. Please remember that these are shared by cars, people, dogs (often on those extendable leashes), bicycles (that should always be walked when going against traffic flow), we even have a few electric mobility scooters running around...and we have lots of tall thick greenery along many of our roads. The Stop Signs are not all just to avoid accidents between cars, they are also to protect people and other things that use the road but might be obscured from a drivers vision by the greenery. Paying attention to the speed limit and the stop signs is part of making Coast Village a better and safer place for all of us.

We had some reports recently of people entering Coast Village and soliciting door-to-door to do yard/tree work. This is not allowed and we have plenty of signs at the entrance about this. If you feel comfortable, go ahead and notify anyone soliciting that they are trespassing and need to leave the village. Also feel free to contact me or Carlla to alert us of this sort of activity.

PARK OPERATIONS REPORT

Water: The water bill for the month of November was 9,852.48. January water bill is \$9,534.18.

Water Project: We have completed 79 water change-outs. We are still working one at a time on Horseshoe Bend and we are also working on Huckleberry and Azalea. I am asking the Finance Committee to look at all of the work we are doing outside the scope of the original project due to the failing of the saddles and lines to the saddles.

The cost of this additional work needs to be approved by the membership and it is an emergent type situation to replace the failing infrastructure as discovered when we started the water meter project. Every saddle and line in the park has to be replaced. They are all failing or coming to the end of their service. Coast Village cannot continue to support rising water costs from leaks. The City will no longer issue credits on water and sewer bills to our HOA. They expect us to fix our water system problem.

I encourage owners to attend the March BOD meeting where you will hear the anticipated costs and options to pay for this additional work. If you have questions please ask.

Spruce Street Fence: Recently an owner discussed the painting on the Spruce Street fence. I want to clarify the status of the fence for their benefit and any other person who might have questions.

There is a small portion of the inside of the fence that did not get painted last year. This was due to a lot of brush growth on the inside of the fence. We had to speak to the owners regarding cutting back the brush in order to have access. By the time all of that was completed the rain had started and we don't paint when the fence is wet. The fence has two coats of paint. The first coat was absorbed by the cedar wood to a great extent and we painted a second coat. The paint we are using is a stain/water resistant type that was recommended by the paint supplier as the best option. When the weather dries out in the late spring we will finish the painting on the inside of the fence and spot paint where necessary on the other areas. The fence has had some warping of the boards and we have replaced nails with screws which will help. If you have questions, please feel free to ask.

Currently we have only two full time maintenance staff, one office staff person and one janitor. In the spring we

will add a part-time maintenance person to assist with roads, brush cutting and painting. This staffing decision was made to keep personnel costs down. Our largest expenditures for the park are staff and utilities.

With our full time maintenance staff busy with the water project we will need a third staff person to help us keep up in the spring.

A special thank you to Richard Franklin who has been monitoring the traffic cams. Letters are being sent out to residents who have multiple instances of running stop signs in the park.

We have had several lots sell in the last few days. Welcome to all of the new owners at Coast Village! We hope you will join in the activities and attend BOD meetings to find out more about our community.

We have had someone by the name of Jarard Hanson soliciting for work removing brush or cutting trees in the park. If someone comes to your door, please call the office and/or advise them this is not allowed in Coast Village. We encourage you not do business with these types of people. You want to make sure the people who cut your trees are licensed and insured. Tell these people they are trespassing. Especially if they are knocking on your door during the weekend!

There have been several complaints on Horseshoe Bend of dogs/puppies running loose and loud yelling. If you have a loose dog on your property, please call Dan Frazier the city code officer at 541-902-2180 or the non emergency police number of 541-995-3515. Identify the problem and let them handle it. If you see a dog tied outside for an extended period let us know. This is against the rules in Coast Village as well.

Remember, if you have questions about something in the park you are always welcome to come to the office. We will assist whenever we can.

Pool: Currently the heating unit is down for the pool. We have ordered another heating unit so that we have a good warranty. The old heater is simply worn out and dangerous to try and use. We hope to have the pool open by Rhody Day weekend weather permitting.

Dues and Past Dues from Owners:

84 Manzanita: The order of default has been entered and the attorneys are drafting the General Judgment of Foreclosure. We are expecting this to go through within the next 60 days.

Total income is down for the fiscal year.

Budgeted income should be \$366,344.22 year to date. Actual income is \$341,172.00. This is a shortfall of income of \$25,172.22 for the year. Most of this shortfall is in unpaid HOA dues of \$25,172.22. \$2,444.43 is unpaid late charges and interest. That is an average of approx. 16 lot owners behind or not paying their HOA fees.

Current bill to be paid from the Reserve Fund is \$6,440.00. A motion needs to be made to move this money from the Reserve to Operations to pay this bill to Scott Ryland. \$5,000.00 of this bill is for the water project contract. \$1,440.00 of this bill is for outside project work of replacing saddles and line labor.

Currently we have spent \$17,355.00 on extra work outside the project scope. We have spent \$ 39,230.00 against the project of \$93,750.00. The Financial Committee will be meeting over the next few weeks to discuss the water repair issues at Coast Village. A report will be generated to explain the additional work that is needed and discussion and recommendations will be made to the BOD at the March meeting.

One lot has been turned over to Vial Fotheringham including a lien. The lot owner defaulted on a repayment contract with Coast Village. This lot is also in arrears with Lane County for taxes.

One lot has been foreclosed on by Lane County on Outer Drive. It will take approximately 12 months before we are able to collect HOA fees from Lane County on this property.

Although we aggressively pursue past due accounts and turn them to a collection agency when we are unable to resolve, basing our budget income for Operations is difficult when we do not receive the income we should. Speaking to our Collection agency they say we are not the only HOA with this issue. With rules around owner rights and our inability to stop water services without court costs it is difficult and expensive to foreclose properties. We need to allow in future budgets in my opinion a % in our A/R to reflect this issue.

Maintenance

We no longer have regular weekend maintenance on site. We do have janitorial staff in the evenings.

If you have an emergency maintenance issue on the weekends you may call the Park Manager at 360-521-8428 and we will do our best to assist you. If it can wait until Monday please call the office after 9:00 a.m.

If you are planning on a weekend visit and need your water turned on, please advise us during the week so the water can be turned on, Friday prior to your visit. If you do not notify us you may not have water for the weekend you are here, or you may be charged if maintenance has to be called in.

Watch for cones on the road. As we continue our "water project" there are holes on the sides of the roads being dug for the change-out of turn-off valves. We do cover them if they intrude into the road and we cone them if they are on the side.

We have slowed down on brush pick-up. This is because we only pick up if we have a least a 1/2 load. It's too costly to only pick up a quarter load and take it to dump. If your debris has not been picked up don't think you have been forgotten.

PLEASE DO NOT PUT ROOF DEBRIS IN YOUR BRUSH PILE!!!! ANY SHINGLES, LUMBER ETC. FROM RE-ROOFING HAS TO GO TO THE DUMP. THE LANDFILL FOR BRUSH DOES NOT RECEIVE BRICKS, ROOF SHINGLES, TAR PAPER ETC. STAFF MUST GO THROUGH THE PILE TO SORT THE TWO OUT.

SEPARATE ANY REPAIR DEBRIS INTO A SEPARATE TIE SO IT CAN BE TAKEN TO THE DUMP. IF YOU MIX THE TWO YOU WILL BE CHARGED LABOR FOR THE SORTING TIME, OR YOUR REFUSE WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.

A reminder to everyone that if you are planning on making additions to your home or lot, you need to check with the Architectural Committee to see if you need to obtain a permit. Generally a permit is required if you are planning to add any type of addition that would change the coverage of the lot.

Remember you could receive a fine from the City if you build without appropriate authority.

The **Greenbelt Committee (GBC)** is here to help lot owners maintain and/or rehabilitate their greenbelt (that is required on both sides and the rear of each lot) by providing advice, labor, and in some cases plants that will work well to fill in a struggling greenbelt.
