Our goal is to never delay any projects, just ensure they have all the required approvals and permits.

Park Operations Report

Good news! Our worker's comp insurance reduced by 9.82% based on our safety record. We received a \$763.00 refund on our yearly insurance. I hope you will join me in thanking our staff for working safely!

Two properties had water terminated in the month of October with one lot owner bringing their account up to date as a result and the second owner coming in to make payment arrangements.

Sewer: Mid-State came to power flush, a block was discovered during the process and I will be running a camera to investigate if this block is a collapsed/broken sewer line or a root issue. If we have a collapse we will have to have it repaired ASAP. If a root ball, it can be cut and ground to open the line.

Water: We have reached a point in our change-outs to move to a different street. The next street will be Sailor. We anticipate some road changes during the change-outs on that street. There were some complaints on the street closures we have had. Some owners feel we are not using enough signage. We do try to notify by posting doors on actual streets that are being closed as well as using volunteers to direct traffic. I don't want to spend additional 100's of dollars on purchasing detour signs etc. We will continue to have some road closures, but not so many as to justify additional expenditure on signage.

We completed a CV property line survey in front of Lot 142. The cost of the survey was \$650.00. This survey allows us to access the ditch at the road near the edge of the property to do any repairs necessary to keep the road secure. The road at this intersection goes across the edge of Lot 261 on the west side of the street. It was important to know the east side boundary of CV property for access. Our maintenance team will be adding some rock to this area on the bank at Lot 142 to maintain the integrity of the bank edge.

Satellite Bath: Utilizing a "special code" appears to be working for keeping unwanted visitors from utilizing the satellite bath as a camping spot. We have had no further incidents since changing the code away from the gate code.

The fire department has recommended that we replace the fire hoses at the club house, we are pricing them. They are quite expensive but necessary.

Club House: Although there have been some complaints about the cooler temperatures in the clubhouse, we are

shutting the heat off at night to conserve electrical costs. The bathrooms are heated at night but not the Rose Room or middle clubhouse. We continue to lose some items from the Rose Room kitchen therefore I am going to put a camera up in there to see if that will encourage people not to remove kitchenware, paper towels and the like.

There are continuing issues with someone not picking up their dog waste on the southeast side of Outer Drive. We have added a couple of cameras there to try and figure out who is doing this. With the potty stations situated throughout the park (which are being well used) there is no excuse for this. We continue to speak in the newsletter about the rules surrounding picking up after your pets.

Maintenance staff have been busy cleaning out storm water basins to prevent flooding as the rainy season starts. If you have an area that you think is not working well for run-off please let us know.

We have had an abundance of dead squirrels and rats being found on the roads which we believe is a result of poison. Once again, I encourage owners to use box traps as a way of rodent control so that other animals (cats, birds, etc.) are not impacted by ingesting poisoned rodents. Compost piles bring in the rats so if you are going to compost please use a composter that is enclosed where they cannot feed or nest. The rat population seems to be greater this year than it has been in the past, the warm dry weather has encouraged population.

The office has received several complaints from lot owners who are concerned about the dying pines in the Village. I have instructed those who are concerned to notify their neighbor by registered mail so that if they don't address a problem tree and it impacts property their insurance won't be impacted for any property damage. We encourage anyone who needs to remove a tree to plant one in its place.

Through the winter the office will be closed from 10:00—10:30 for a class on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We still open at 9:00 am and will remain open until 3:00 pm. Maintenance is always available.

We have been advertising the BOD email addresses on the front of our newsletter. I am removing those as BOD members are receiving viruses on their addresses. There is a link on our website if you wish to e-mail a BOD directly.

A garden layout showing the raised beds that are available for residents to claim has been submitted to the office. If you're interested in gardening either next season or beginning right away, please go by the office and choose a bed. Right now there are four existing beds available, and there is space in the garden area to build several more if those are all claimed.

Two strawberry beds, an herb bed and all the beds along the fence will be maintained as community beds, but we're hoping to have individuals take over the others so that they will be well-kept during the growing season. Ila Mae has volunteered to renovate the strawberry beds soon. They were renovated last spring, but the plants were set too late and they didn't produce much.

Architectural Committee Tips

A reminder to everyone that if you are planning on making additions to your home or lot, you need to check with the Architectural Committee to see if you need to obtain a permit. Generally a permit is required if you are planning to add any type of addition that would change the coverage of the lot.

Remember you could receive a fine from the City if you build without appropriate authority.

The **Greenbelt Committee (GBC)** is here to help lot owners maintain and/or rehabilitate their greenbelt (that is required on both sides and the rear of each lot) by providing advice, labor, and in some cases plants that will work well to fill in a struggling greenbelt. Dues and Past Dues from Owners:

Total Past Due Accounts: **\$47,750.81**

Of this total past due, \$24,698.00 is not associated with 84 Manzanita. This amount is about 65 percent greater than the \$15,000 that we had allotted for Bad Accounts in this year's budget. Every effort possible is being made to collect from these accounts and it is clear that some will have to be written off at the end of the year.

84 Manzanita: \$23,052.81 is owed, which we hope to receive after the property goes to auction. Documents were sent on 8/27 to CMAC for approval to send to auction.

The Termination of Utilities have been completed on two additional properties this month. Four properties now have their utilities shut off due to lack of payment of monthly dues.

Water Project:

An additional \$2,440 has been collected in September from the water project assessment and transferred to Reserve. The total amount of the \$37,500 Water Project Assessment received to date is: \$26,455 and all has been transferred to the Reserve.

A motion is required to transfer \$11,590 from Reserves to Operations for the Water Project work.

RECIPE CORNER

One Pan Chicken and Veggies

Ingredients

1 1/2 pounds

chicken thighs, skin on but bones removed

1 pound small red potatoes, halved

1 teaspoon kosher salt

1 tablespoon maple syrup

1 tablespoon Dijon mustard

1 pound broccoli, trimmed and cut into 1-inch pieces

Instructions

Heat the oven and baking sheet: Arrange a rack in the middle of the oven and heat to 400°F. Place a rimmed baking sheet in the oven while the oven is heating.

Season the chicken and potatoes: Season the chicken and potatoes all over with the salt.

Start roasting the chicken and potatoes: Place the chicken skin-side down in the middle of the hot baking sheet. Add the potatoes around the edge of the baking sheet, immediately return the sheet to the oven, and roast for 15 minutes. Meanwhile, combine the maple syrup and mustard in a small bowl.

Add the broccoli: Flip the chicken skin side up. Brush the chicken with the maple-mustard mixture. Add the broccoli to the baking sheet.

Bake until crispy: Bake until the chicken and potatoes are crispy, about 15 minutes more. Let cool on the baking sheet for 10 minutes before serving.

Recipe Notes

Storage: Leftovers can be stored in an airtight container in the refrigerator for up to 4 days.
