Park Operations Report

September already! Remember we have a BOD meeting scheduled for September 15th. If you have not attended a Board meeting maybe you should. It will help you understand how the HOA functions.

We have had road changes as we continue our work on the water system. Your patience is appreciated as roads are re-routed for the day or you see cones on holes at the edge of the road.

We are currently working on Outer Drive, the next section of road work will be on Sailor Lane. This is a narrow street so drive carefully and don't speed.

One of our part-time workers, Michelle, has left Coast Village. I want to thank her for all her hard work—her great job on refinishing our Coast Village entrance signs, painting of arrows on the roadways and in general always doing whatever was needed. She will be missed.

I won't be replacing her so we will no longer have a maintenance person on the weekends. All the more reason to remind you that if you have been traveling and need your water turned on let us know the week prior so you don't return to a home without water. The new system is not going to allow you to turn your water on or off for yourself. It requires a special tool. Maintenance must do it.

With Kim and Michelle leaving the park it also means we need to elect a new Board member. The paperwork has been sent out to all members. Please consider running for the Board. And when the election happens think carefully about who you vote for. We need Board members who are willing to consider the best outcomes for all owners in the park.

At the next Board meeting the CC&R Committee will be submitting to the Board our draft of the new proposed CC&Rs for approval to send to our attorney and then to the Association for their vote and approval. Remember it takes a 75% "yes" vote to pass. It is very important you take the time to vote. There has been a huge amount of work and thought put into the proposed new document. Please show your appreciation by voting.

If you have questions about the proposed document, bring those questions to the Board meeting. You can find the draft document on our website.

We have been blowing roads and raking the sides for debris and we are still finding tons of cigarette butts being discarded. PLEASE do not throw your "butts" out of a window, it's a fire hazard and please if you are walking and you smoke, put your cigarette out, take it home and dispose of it. You may think "mine won't make a difference" but there are "many" and it is unsightly on our roads.

Our neighborhood is changing a bit with new faces. We welcome new owners and invite everyone to attend potlucks, coffee on Wednesdays and enjoy the pool which will be open at least another month. If you have questions please stop in the office.

We have placed all of the pet waste stations. Thank you for using them. There are 5 stations set around the east side of the park. They are emptied once per week. Advise the office if you see they have run out of waste disposal bags.

Do you have a great idea that would improve Coast Village? We are always open to ideas and want to know what you think. If you like our staff, let them know—they are here to serve you and appreciate a "good job" once in awhile.

The pool will now be closing at dusk around 7:00 p.m. soon it will close even earlier. We have many people enjoying the water this year. Please make sure you shower before entering and make sure small children have a swim diaper on. Thank you for cleaning up after yourselves.

Cards were sent out for a survey on the use of motorcycles in the park. Please be sure and send back the stamped self addressed postcard so we hear your views. We care what you think.

We are making a change in the women's bath at the clubhouse. We are changing out the push button on and off to a regular faucet. Please when using this shower, remember to turn it off. We are having issues with the push type faucets and they are too expensive to continue to replace as they fail.

Remember starting on September 1st, it will take a "special" code to enter the satellite bath. Please call the office if you use this bath for the number.

Changes—the water aerobic group are doing chair yoga now—don't forget to join in!!!

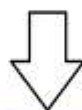
Step 1: Relocate minnows and other water critters.

DEPRESSION

Depression (major depressive disorder) is a common and serious medical illness that negatively affects how you feel, the way you think and how you act. Fortunately, it is also treatable. Depression causes feelings of sadness and/or a loss of interest in activities once enjoyed. It can lead to a variety of emotional and physical problems and can decrease a person's ability to function at work and at home.

Depression symptoms can vary from mild to severe and can include:

- Feeling sad or having a depressed mood
- Loss of interest or pleasure in activities once enjoyed
- Changes in appetite — weight loss or gain unrelated to dieting
- Trouble sleeping or sleeping too much
- Loss of energy or increased fatigue
- Increase in purposeless physical activity (e.g., hand-wringing or pacing) or slowed movements and speech (actions observable by others)
- Feeling worthless or guilty
- Difficulty thinking, concentrating or making decisions. Thoughts of death or suicide.

Remember there is help out there if you are feeling depressed. You are not alone. Depression impacts 1 out of 6 people . Reach out—you are not alone.

THE COMMUNITY GARDEN

A reminder to everyone regarding the Community Garden. Coast Village has several people who work hard in the garden, weeding, watering, planting. Some of the boxes are private and some are for community gathering.

We have recently had issues with people coming into the garden and picking everything they can that's ripe and some things that are not ripe—leaving nothing behind for others. Do not harvest more than one time per week. Do not take more than you can eat at one meal.

If it continues, anyone doing it will be prohibited from using any produce from the garden boxes.

I you want to grow a box of your own, you need to sign up in the office. There are boxes available for next year if you wish to reserve one.

If the situation does not change we may need to stop any community harvesting.

Architectural Committee Tips

A reminder to everyone that if you are planning on making additions to your home or lot, you need to check with the Architectural Committee to see if you need to obtain a permit. Generally a permit is required if you are planning to add any type of addition that would change the coverage of the lot.

Remember you could receive a fine from the City if you build without appropriate authority.

The **Greenbelt Committee (GBC)** is here to help lot owners maintain and/or rehabilitate their greenbelt (that is required on both sides and the rear of each lot) by providing advice, labor, and in some cases plants that will work well to fill in a struggling greenbelt. RECIPE CORNER

Cracker Barrel Meatloaf

INGREDIENTS

- 1-1/2 lbs. lean ground beef
- 3 eggs
- 1-1/2 sleeves crushed Ritz crackers
- 1/2 cup finely chopped onion
- 1/4 cup finely diced green pepper (can be omitted if you prefer)
- 4 oz. shredded sharp cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper

Topper

1/2 cup ketchup

1/2 cup brown sugar

1 tsp mustard

Preheat oven to 350. Line a baking sheet with parchment or aluminum foil.

Mix the topping ingredients in a small bowl; set aside

In a large bowl, beat the eggs then add the cracker crumbs, onion, green pepper, milk, salt, pepper and cheese.

Add the ground beef and mix well. Turn out the meatloaf mixture onto the pan; shape into a loaf. Bake for 30 minutes then spread topping on top of the meatloaf. Bake for an additional 30 minutes or until done.

Let stand for 5—10 minutes to rest then slice and serve.

This also makes great sandwiches!



Garden Beds for 2019

Do you love fresh veggies? Have a little extra time on your hands? If yes, think about planting and harvesting from a garden bed in the Coast Village community garden! As many of you know, Darren and Jay renovated and planted most of the garden beds for the current season. Those beds have been open to all CV residents for harvest, though people have not always been clear about what that means. Some have over-harvested, while others have been timid about harvesting because they weren't sure what was what. See Carlla's article in this issue about fair harvests from community beds.

It's really been a lot of work for Darren and Jay to take on, especially since we haven't had any significant rainfall since June, and the beds require frequent watering. We thank them for their diligence and efforts, and for making the gardens so beautiful and productive! Darren has said he will probably not be in the garden as much during the next season, and Jay has been roped into doing all kinds of work for the community, so for the next gardening season most of the garden beds will be open for CV households to use as private beds.

As of September 17, your household can sign up to manage a bed or two for the next season. Several beds will be open soon. If you're a full-timer, there's lots of potential to plant greens and other cool-weather crops for the winter. Otherwise, you can plant when you get back next Spring. Carlla will have a chart in the office showing the available beds. Note that there is room to build several more beds if we need them.

We are considering forming a loosely-structured Garden Committee that would meet as needed to set rules and discuss issues surrounding the garden. The Committee might also be available to help with gardening advice, and perhaps we could even hold some informal gardening workshops to help novices, if there's a demand.

An endless passion for **music**, for **faith**,

His peers regard him as one of the greatest **acoustic guitar players** of our generation. The **Inspirational Country Music Association** has awarded him **Musician of the Year** seven times, **Entertainer of the Year** three times, and the **Living Legend award**. Dennis has been a musical staple at the biggest evangelical crusades in the world since 1974. Good and fast would describe both his God-given talent and his career.

Dennis began his musical journey playing trumpet, then picked up the guitar at age 15. He was **inspired** by Joe Maphis, Clarence White, the bluegrass band The Dillards, and others. He would often sneak backstage and learn tricks of the trade from some of the best musicians of the day. Only two years later he won the Hollywood Bowl Battle of the Bands with his brother Danny and friend Don Beck. Very quickly his incredible talent and dynamic personality began to open doors.

One day in 1967 he played a Christian coffeehouse in Hollywood called the Salt Company. At that moment he felt a profound calling and his ministry began. Dennis realized he had the gift of connecting with people through his music and the communication skills to connect them with God and His plan for their lives. To this day that calling is the center of his life.

Dennis's musical style is eclectic, performing a mix of **bluegrass, gospel, country, and classical**. Without a distinct genre, he hasn't enjoyed radio airplay to the extent that others with his talent would have. Despite that lack of exposure, he still enjoys a large audience. He has been seen on numerous television specials, USO shows, and at bluegrass festivals. He has also shared the stage with such well-known artists as **Johnny Cash, Charlie Daniels, Ricky Skaggs, Michael W. Smith, and Darius Rucker**. In addition he has scored three motion pictures and three ABC television special
